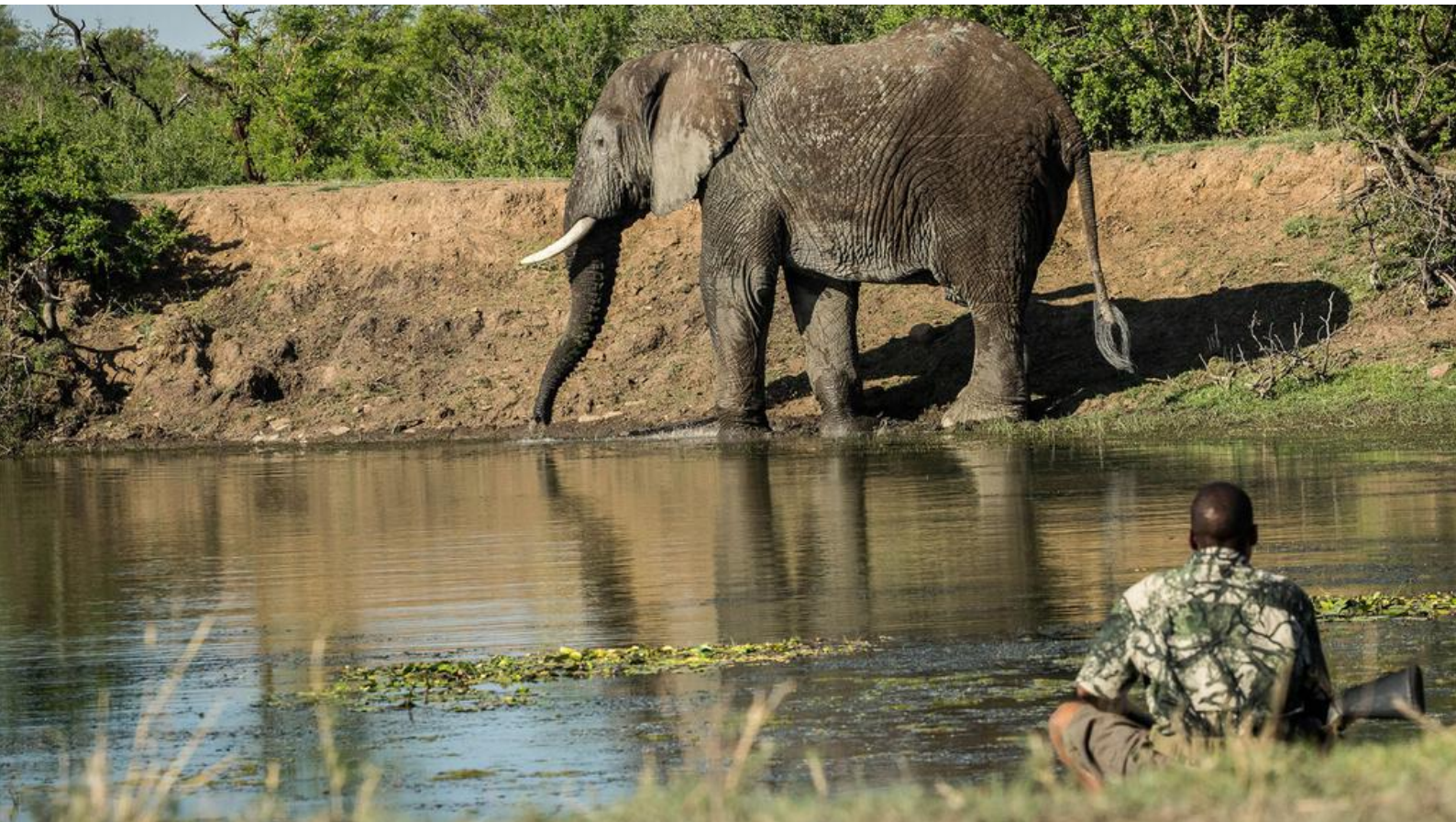

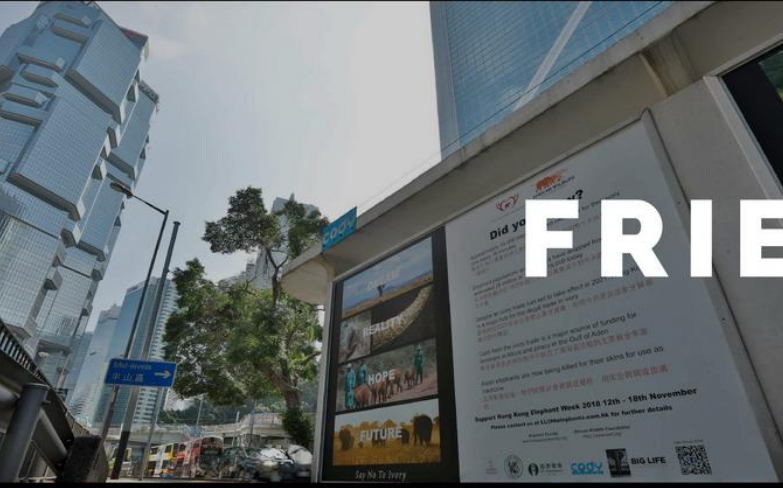

Our Ranger Insurance Fund Raising Project aims to provide up to 2,000 Rangers Accident insurance coverage, annually. Amidst the Covid induced chaos, The Elephant Foundation managed to organize our annual dinner amongst other events through 2021. To date, along with our supporters we have raised coverage for more than 270 Rangers. Our goal moving forward is to achieve insurance coverage for 2,000 rangers per annum.

IN GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY



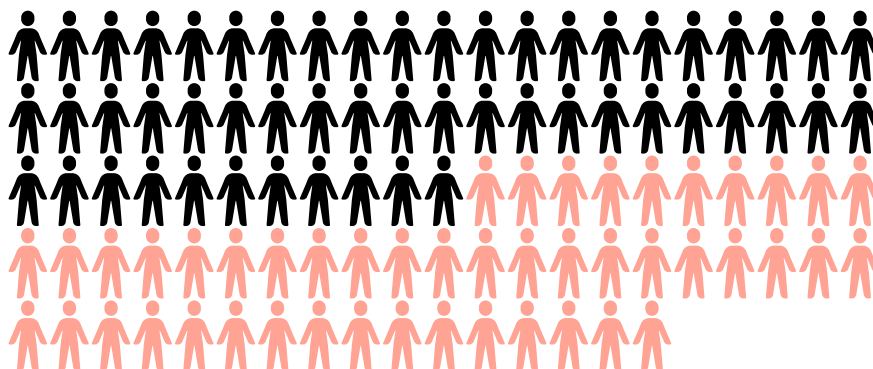
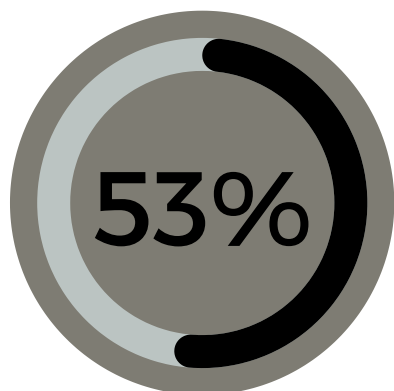
Game Rangers are essentially Conservation Officers of protected areas for wildlife and biodiversity. Rangers' prime responsibilities are to ensure territorial and biological integrity of the conservation area under their management.

Rangers' tasks are multi-faceted which include:

- Territorial wildlife crime combat
- Fire and wildlife population management
- Natural studies and scientific support
- Generation of conservation awareness
- Human-wildlife conflict management
- Community outreach, support and education

MOTIVATION AND JOB SATISFACTION



Fifty-three percent (53%) of Rangers report to have **LOW JOB SATISFACTION.**^[1]

With wildlife crime and poaching at unprecedented and unsustainable levels, rangers are global wildlife's frontline of defence. To further improve global conservation efforts more emphasis on the wellbeing of rangers must be taken into account. Increasing ranger job satisfaction will likely lead to higher commitment in protecting wildlife, communities and improved conservation performance.

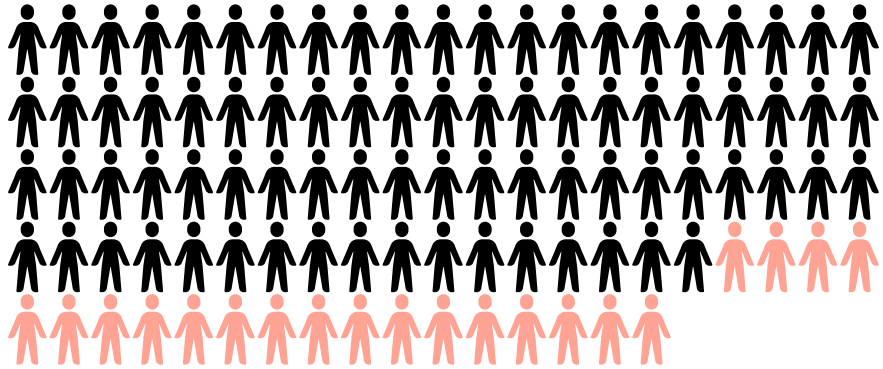
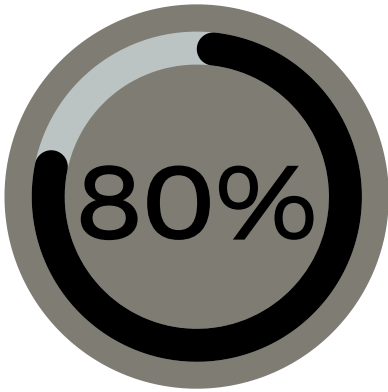
Our project aims to improve work satisfaction by :

- Helping with education for rangers' families

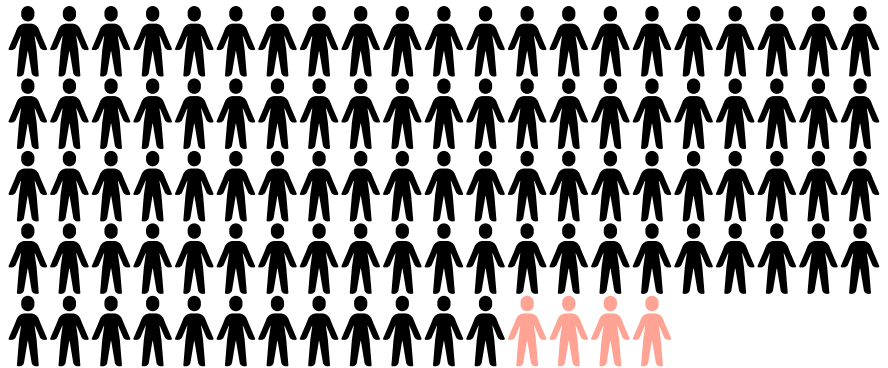
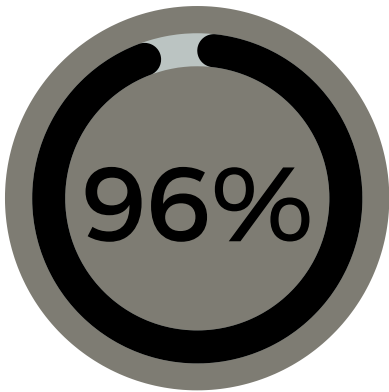

Rangers work against all odds on the front line in protecting and managing wildlife. They, quite literally, stand between the poacher and his rifle. Rangers are murdered by militia groups, poachers and bandits by planned attacks whilst protecting our wildlife and ecosystems.

The Elephant Foundation has contributed tremendously in the battle to stop the illegal wildlife trade. Our objectives are met by educating youths on the impacts of poaching and wildlife conservation, helping local communities realize the value of keeping wildlife alive and supporting rangers.

To date, our impact in Hong Kong includes:

- Anti-poaching and wildlife conservation education to over **20,000 students**
- Collectively working with other NGO's to implement the push of the ban on the sale of Ivory, effective 31/12/21
- Held 8 fundraising dinners
- Assisted with over 400 orphan animal adoptions
- Help local and communities abroad live with wildlife harmoniously.
